### The Face of Jesus

There are artists who work with small pieces of glass and stone to make pictures they call “mosaics”. Some pieces are bright red, others warm purple, others cold blue or dull green. Some are even shiny gold. To look at the pieces individually, they may seem precious and valuable, but they may also seem ordinary – even worthless.

The artist, *John de Rosen*, brought together 4,000 pieces of color to make the mosaic that covers the ceiling in the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C.

All those pieces contribute to *de Rosen’s* gorgeous picture of the Face of Jesus.

But what about the pieces of a life?

## ST. LEONARD

FEASTDAY: NOVEMBER 6TH

Saint Leonard was born towards the end of the III<sup>rd</sup> century. He was the child of illustrious parents who resided in Gaul, a province that would one day be known as France. As Leonard grew, he was so moved by the holy examples of the bishop of Rheims that he renounced the world in order to lead a more perfect life. The king wanted to make him a permanent member of his court, but Saint Leonard replied that he preferred to live in the obscurity Christ had chosen for Himself, and he retired to a monastery. The reputation of Saint Leonard's goodness and sanctity soon spread, and the sick came to him for healing and alms.

Saint Maximin, the abbot of the monastery, saw to it that St. Leonard was ordained a deacon. St. Leonard accepted out of obedience, but he did not aspire to any additional ecclesiastical dignities. He recognized that his role was not to remain always in the monastery. He left there, and on a nearby mountain he found a solitary place in the forest where he built a cell of branches and devoted himself to meditation, prayer and mortification. He continued to obtain miracles when the suffering beseeched him. Due to the power of St. Leonard's prayers, the wife of a nearby king made it through a difficult childbirth. The king rewarded St. Leonard for his prayers by giving him all the land he could cover by riding around on a donkey in a day.

Soon the sick came to Saint Leonard. Prisoners who invoked him from their cells saw their chains break before their eyes. Many of them came to him afterwards, bringing their heavy chains and irons to offer in homage. A considerable number wished to remain with him, and he often gave them part of his vast forest to clear, that they might have the means to live an honest life. He continued to be their guardian and father and preached the religion of our Savior. They were transformed by prayer and labor.

He remained there evangelizing the surrounding area until his death. Miracles on behalf of prisoners and the sick followed his death as they had prior to his dying. He is invoked by women in labor and by prisoners of war. His feast day is November 6.
