St. Porphyrius Feast Day Feb. 26th

St. Porphyrius was the Bishop of Gaza in Palestine at Thessalonica. He lived five years in the Egyptian desert of Scete then moved to a cave near the Jordan where he lived another five years. In spite of his impaired health, he frequently visited the scene of the Resurrection. Here he met the Asiatic Mark, who later became a deacon of his church and his biographer. In order to sell the property still owned by Porphyrius in his native city, Mark set out for Thessalonica and, upon his return, the proceeds from the sale of these properties were distributed among the monasteries of Egypt and among the needy in and around Jerusalem. In 392 Porphyrius was ordained to the priesthood, and the relic of the Holy Cross was entrusted to his care. In 395 he became Bishop of Gaza, a stronghold of paganism. The attitude of the pagan population was hostile so that the bishop appealed to the emperor for protection and pleaded repeatedly for the destruction of pagan temples. He finally obtained permission to destroy the pagan sanctuaries at Gaza. A Christian church was erected on the site of the temple of Marnas.

A Different Approach to Fasting...

Fasts have a tendency to be oriented toward things like giving up food or television. But there are many other creative ways we can welcome Jesus' healing touch.

Here are suggestions you may want to consider.

- 1. **Fast from anger and hatred.** Give your family an extra dose of love each day.
- **2. Fast from judging others.** Before making any judgments, recall how Jesus overlooks our faults.
- 3. **Fast from discouragement.** Hold on to Jesus' promise that He has a perfect plan for your life.
- 4. **Fast from complaining.** When you find yourself about to complain, close your eyes and recall some of the little moments of joy Jesus has given you.
- 5. **Fast from resentment or bitterness!** Work on forgiving those who may have hurt you.
- 6. **Fast from spending too much money**. Try to reduce your spending by ten percent and give those savings to the poor.
- 7. It's up to you to add any resolution that you feel can help you to be prepare yourself for Easter.
