How to Talk to an Angry Man

The man is angry at God. He blames God for the dysfunctional family in which he was raised. He feels that God is responsible for so many of his struggles and the abuses that exist in the world. It's God's fault that loved ones suffer cancer, that parents of young children get divorced, that babies die.

Why Doesn't God... almighty God... step in and make things better?

So the man is upset. He's mad. He's as angry as he can be.

Now, suppose you were the angry man's counselor, his friend...or his priest. Is there anything you could say that would make him feel better? Is there any advice that would change the way he is thinking? Or must his anger inevitably fester into bitterness and loss of Faith?

Well...there is a principle we learn in psychology class that says: To express anger is part of the process of healing that anger.

If that is true, then it should be helpful to tell the man this: "My dear angry friend, you need to talk to God. You need to express your very real and honest feelings... and know for certain that God is big enough to accept criticism. This talk with the Lord is what religious people call "prayer". Persist in this conversation. Do not stop! Then allow God's grace to reply to your pain.

I believe that, as the angry man and God grow closer in prayer, they will become...friends.

It's harder to be angry with a friend. It's easier also to forgive that friend...especially when you do finally come to understand just how much He really loves you.

St Demetrios the Great Martyr

Feastday: October 26

Saint Demetrios was born in Thesaloniki, Greece in 270 AD. He came from a wealthy family and because he was athletic in appearance and heroic in spirit, he became a high-ranking officer in the Roman Army at a very young age. He considered himself a soldier of Christ first, and a military soldier second. He spent most of his time as a devout missionary, preaching the Gospel at secret meetings and converting pagans to the Christian faith.

At one of these meetings, he was captured and placed in front of the Emperor Maximian, who wanted to learn the truth about the conversions. Saint Demetrios proclaimed his faith by saying: "...only in Christ do I believe." With that proclamation, Maximian ordered that Saint Demetrios be sent to prison and subjected to the cruelest tortures.

Even though Saint Demetrios was imprisoned, he did not stop preaching the gospel to those who came to see him. In jail, he was visited by his follower, Nestoras. Nestoras was a man of small stature and had come to ask for his beloved teacher's blessing to fight in the upcoming gladiator games. The emperor had decided to use the games as a duel between Christianity and paganism by challenging any Christian to a fight against the athletic giant, Leo.

With the blessing of Saint Demetrios, Nestoras fought and killed Leo. Enraged at the loss of his favorite gladiator, the emperor commanded that Nestoras be beheaded on the spot. Recognizing that Saint Demetrios was the inspiring power behind Nestoras, the emperor ordered that Saint Demetrios be executed by spear on October 26, 306 AD. Christians buried the body of Saint Demetrios at the place of his execution and because of the beautiful scent that emanated from his tomb, he was named Mirovlis or "The Myrrh Gusher".

The most ancient icons of Saint Demetrios may be found in his temple in Thessaloniki where he is the patron saint. This is not just because he was born and died there, but because the people believe it was his intervention that saved the city during many attacks by Slavic nations, the Bulgarians, Arabs, Saracens and others. Even the liberation of Thessaloniki during the Balkan wars of 1912 coincide with the feast day of Saint Demetrios on October 26th.
