What if Jesus didn't rise?

Each year we congratulate each other during Easter season saying: "Christ is risen" and we answer "truly risen" (المسيح قام، حقا قام). We know that we received all the fruits of his salvation, of his death and Resurrection, There is no salvation without our participation. There is continuity and complementarity. Each time we celebrate the Eucharist and/or we serve each other, we continue and we participate in what Jesus did. We do them currently. Salvation didn't happen in the past for one time only, but it's happening every day in our life. But did we ever stop to think what would have happened if Jesus didn't rise from the death?

St Paul said in his letter to the Corinthians: "if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God [...] if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins". St Paul is right. Can you imagine a world without Faith? Can you imagine Christianity without the Church? No priests, no sacraments, no Eucharist, no community, no spiritual life... Of course the Resurrection of Jesus is the source of our Christian life. The Life – God - could not stay in death. But what about the teaching and message of Jesus? Aren't they enough to believe in Him as our Lord and God?

The followers of Jesus recognized that this man from Galilee was professing of pure love and faith and they realized that such a message could/would change the world. They made him the Messiah instead of just another Prophet. That is why the Christian faith is not in vain if Jesus did not rise from the dead: the historical truth is meaningless compared to the modern perception and the timeless teachings.

Saint Paul concluded: "But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep". Don't trouble yourself any longer with the thought. Christ has risen! We will, too! Let the celebration continue forever!!! Let us be the children of the Resurrection and live as saved with joy and happiness.

NEW 7 WONDERS OF NATURE

The Jeita Grotto located north of Beirut has qualified as one of 28 finalists being voted on as the New 7 Wonders of Nature. The Grotto is a compound of crystallized caves which include upper galleries and a lower cave through which a 6,230 m long river runs. In this cave water in the limestone has created vaults full of various sizes, colors and shapes of stalactites and stalagmites, majestic curtains and fantastic rock formations. Currently, the Grotto ranks 13 on the list of 28 sites competing for the top seven spots. St. Catherine of Siena - Feastday April 29th



The 25th child of a wool dyer in northern Italy, St. Catherine started having mystical experiences when she was only six, seeing guardian angels as clearly as the people they protected. She became a Dominican when she was 16, and continued to have visions of Christ, Mary, and the saints.

St. Catherine was one of the most brilliant theological minds of her day, although she never had any formal education. She persuaded the Pope to go back to Rome from Avignon, in 1377, and when she died she was endeavoring to heal the Great Western Schism.

In 1375 Our Lord give her the Stigmata, which was visible only after her death. St. Catherine's letters, and a treatise called "a dialogue" are considered among the most brilliant writings in the history of the Catholic Church. She died when she was only 33, and her body was found incorrupt in 1430.

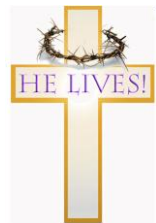
