Jacob of Nisibis

Feastday: January 13

St Jacob of Nisibis was a Syriac saint who died in AD 338. He was the second bishop of Nisibis, spiritual father of the renowned Syriac writer Ephrem the Syrian, and a person who practiced rigorous self discipline.

Jacob was appointed bishop, in 308, of the Christian community of Nisibis in Mesopotamia near the Turkey/Syria border. Jacob of Nisibis, also known as James of Nisibis and as Jacob of Nusaybin, is recorded as a signer at the First Council of Nicaea in 325. He was the first Christian to search for the Ark of Noah, which he claimed to find a piece of on a mountain, Mount Judi (Turkish Cudi Dağı), 70 miles (110 km) from Nisibis.

He founded the basilica and theological School of Nisibis after the model of the school of Diodorus of Tarsus in Antioch. Jacob was the teacher and spiritual director of Saint Ephrem the Syrian, a great ascetic, teacher and hymn writer who combatted Arianism. St. James's learning and writings have procured him a rank next to St. Ephrem among the doctors of the Syriac church; and the Armenians honour him as one of the principal doctors of their national church. For though St. James was a Syrian, he wrote excellent treatises in the Armenian language for their instruction.

Much of Jacob's public ministry, like that of other Syrian ascetics, can be seen as socially cohesive in the context of the Late Roman East. In the face of the withdrawal of wealthy landowners to the large cities, holy men such as Jacob acted as impartial and necessary arbiters in disputes between peasant farmers and within the smaller towns.

Saint Jacob of Nisibis's relics are in the church he founded in Nisibis. His Feastday is January 13th.
