What Do You Catholics Believe Anyway?

Have you ever been asked that, especially at the beginning of Lent, when you walk around on Ash Monday (or Wednesday) so marked on your forehead that everyone knows you are one of those Catholics?

What do you say? Certainly, you're not going to expound on the catechism ... the Trinity, the Incarnation, the Redemption ... your questioner really doesn't want a long answer. He just wants to know, briefly, what the wearer of those ashes stands for.

Well, in one sentence, this is it: We Catholics believe that the life of the Spirit is more important than any **thing**.

Although that statement is brief, it means a whole lot. It means that we hold that a small child, who knows the existence of God and believes in the Blessed Trinity, knows more than all the college professors throughout the whole world who deny there is a God. The Spiritual life, to us, is that important.

Therefore, a holy hour spent before the Blessed Sacrament does more good for the well-being of the world than days of talking about progress in Washington. The life of the Spirit, we believe, is that important.

Therefore, one sinner returning to God is of more value and is more a cause for celebrating than hundreds of hostages returning safely home from captivity ... and the Spirit is so important that we consider the increase of God's grace, a better thing than the increase of our bank account.

We believe that all the beauties of nature cannot compare in the least to a soul in the state of grace ... and that the profoundest of scientific discoveries is nothing





Archbishop Beshara al-Rahi elected 77th Patriarch of Antioch for the Maronites



On Tuesday, March 13, Monsignor Youssef Tawk announced from the seat of the church in Bkirki that Archbishop of Jbeil, Beshara al-Rahi had been elected the 77th Patriarch of Antioch for the Maronites to succeed Nasrallah Sfeir.

Patriarch Rahi was born Feb. 25, 1940, in Himlaya, Lebanon. He was ordained a priest of the Maronite Order of the Blessed Virgin Mary (OMM) Sept. 3, 1967, and was ordained a bishop in 1986. He has served as bishop of Jbeil since 1990.

The new patriarch founded the NDU University of Louaizeh, and has served as president of the Lebanese bishops' communications committee and hosted a weekly program on Telelumiere, Lebanon's Christian television station. The program, "Boushra al Rahi," which means "Good News of the Shepherd," provided commentary and teaching on that Sunday's Gospel, and the patriarch encouraged listeners to live the Scriptures in a practical way.

At his request, Patriarch Rahi will officially be installed on the feast of the Annunciation, March 25 at 5pm in Lebanon (11 am Flint). Catholic patriarchs do not have their elections confirmed by the Pope, but the new Patriarch will request and receive spiritual communion from Pope Benedict XVI.

The new Patriarch Rahi can play a **very constructive role for the future of Christians in the Middle East and diaspora**, and he is known for being very courageous in expressing his point of view, and actually **he speaks out what he believes in**.

Dear Parishioners, with this election, "Our joy has no limit". The 77th patriarch of the Maronite Catholic Church said "Communion and Charity" would be his motto. Let us continue to live this "communion and Charity" with joy in our community. Congratulations for all of us and thank you for the Holy Spirit for his gift for our humanity.

The Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary



The Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary is related in Luke 1:26-38. The angel Gabriel was sent from God to the Virgin Mary, at Nazareth, a small town Galilee. Mary was of the house of David, and was espoused to Joseph. The angel having taken the figure and the form of man, came into the house and said to her: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee." Mary having heard the greeting words did not speak; she was troubled in spirit, since she did not know the angel, nor the cause of his coming, nor the meaning of the salutation. The angel continued and said: "Fear not, Mary, for thou hast found grace with God. Behold thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and shalt bring forth a son; and thou shalt call his name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of David his father; and he shall reign in the house of Jacob forever. And of his kingdom there shall be no end." The Virgin answered, "How shall this be done, because I know not man?"

The angel to remove Mary's anxiety and to assure her that her virginity would be spared, answered: "The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee and the power of the Most High shall overshadow thee. And therefore also the Holy which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God." In token of the truth of his word he made known to her the conception of St. John, the miraculous pregnancy of her relative now old and sterile: "And behold, thy cousin Elizabeth; she also has conceived a son in her old age, and this is the sixth month with her that is called barren: because no word shall be impossible with God." Mary may not yet have fully understood the meaning of the heavenly message and how the maternity might be reconciled with her vow of virginity, but clinging to the first words of the angel and trusting to the Omnipotence of God she said: "Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it done to me according to thy word."
